From the President

In March, the chapter participated in two memorable events. Bill Heitbrink, Roger Argalas, Mike Glaser, Ken Bowman and Al Brauer collaborated with the Daughters of the American Revolution at the NATIONAL VIETNAM WAR VETERANS DAY COMMEMORATION AND WREATH LAYING CEREMONY in Monroe Ohio. So many of the veterans were quite happy to receive a formal thank you for their service and their friends applauded every veteran that was recognized with a Vietnam War commemoration pin. These pins mean much to the recipients. I thank Al Brauer for leading this effort for our chapter.

On March 30, our chapter celebrated the 50th anniversary of our founding with a grand celebration dinner at the Metropolitan Club in Covington KY. I must thank all those who participated in planning this event. I especially need to thank Roger Argalas, CAPT (Ret) USCG who lead the efforts to organize this magnificent event. Our guests from the national office of MOAA included President and CEO Brian Kelly, Lt. General (Ret) USAF, and Erin Stone, CAPT (Ret) USN. CAPT Stone is the director of council and chapter affairs. Both were impressed with the near capacity attendance at this meeting. General Kelly spoke about MOAA advocacy efforts during his talk. Clearly, we all need to carefully cooperate with these advocacy efforts on the MOAA website and submit letters and messages to our representatives in Washington.

At the state level, advocacy is done by the local chapters and state wide councils. Presently, Al Echt is leading an effort to modify the state law concerning the municipal taxation of active duty pay and benefits. The current state law applies to the "Armed Forces". There is an effort to replace the term "armed forces" with the term "uniformed services" in the Ohio Revised Code. This change would include the commissioned corps of the PHS and NOAA. Legislation can move quickly and I will ask chapter members to write letter supporting this effort to members of Ohio of the Ohio legislature. I will email this request to you and I will provide directions for sending letters of support to our representatives in the OHIO House and Senate.

This newsletter contains a registration form for the upcoming membership meeting. We have two more events for which we have not finalized the arrangements. On July 23, there are limited number of tickets available for attending the Dayton Dragons baseball game in Dayton Ohio. This is a joint outing with the Dayton Chapter of MOAA. Our September membership meeting will likely be a social gathering at the Hopping Vines bar in Montgomery Ohio. When information for both events becomes available, I will send out an email message providing the details.

11 principles of Military Leadership

The 11 principles of Army leadership first appeared in an Army field manual in 1948. They were developed by skilled leaders who were veterans of World War II, the Greatest Generation. They have been passed down, largely unchanged, to this day, with slight modifications. Here they are, as changed to recognize that both men and women are part of the team. (In original form, it read, for example, "know your men and be concerned for their welfare".)

- 1. Know yourself and seek self-improvement.
- 2. Be technically and tactically proficient.
- 3. Know your subordinates and look out for their welfare.
- 4. Keep subordinates informed.
- 5. Set the example.
- 6. Insure the task is understood, supervised, and accomplished.
- 7. Train your subordinates as a team.
- 8. Make sound and timely decisions.
- 9. Develop a sense of responsibility among your subordinates.
- 10. Employ your command in accordance with its capabilities.
- 11. Seek responsibility and take responsibility for your actions.

In modern times, it is difficult to find a better outline for success, whether in the military or civilian life, than inculcating and using the principles of military leadership.
