Please take a few moments of your valuable time to push MOAA's agenda seeking to help our brothers and susters in the uniformed services to your senators and congresspersons. Here's how:

- 1. Go to the MOAA website (MOAA.org) and register for this site. This step is needed to correctly identify your senators and representatives.
- 2. Now that you are regisytered, log onto MOAA's website, (MOAA.org).
- 3. Next, click on the heading "Advocacy". Then click on the heading "Legislative Action Center". You will then be at this website page: https://moaa.quorum.us/. This page will give the option of writing to our legislators about a variety of issues.
- 4. Pick your issue, then click on the button labeled "Write". You will be presented with a draft letter which you can either edit or accept as drafted.
- 5. Click on the button labeled "**Submit Selected Letters**". The letter is sent to your senators and representative automatically.

The site also allows nonmembers to register for MOAA.org. Because legislative issues are often short-fuse, I will use email messages to alert you to such needs.

Your chapter has a website and a Facebook page. The website (Cincymoaa.org) provides information about upcoming meetings, access to the chapters past and present newsletters, and photographs from past events. It addition, the website has a link to chapter's Facebook page, run by Matt Wetzel, (https://www.facebook.com/groups/1189243865230481/), with lots of great information, a page which you should visit.

Finally, I encourage you to attend the March membership meeting, now held on March 22nd one week later than normal, to accommodate our speaker, David Corlett. (see page 1), Sergeant Corlett will tell us about his experience as a Cincinnati Police Officer, his experience interacting with the local veteran community and his program's development into a nationwide program. Legislative affairs

CAPT (Ret) Alan Echt, USPHS

This is my first column, and I have big shoes to fill. We owe a huge debt of gratitude to BG (Ret) Tom O'Brien for his many years of service to the Chapter as legislative liaison. I'll try to live up to his example.

According to the Associated Press, the first session of the 118th Congress was one of the least productive, "With just 27 bills and resolutions signed into law, not counting a few board appointments, it's among the most do-nothing sessions of Congress in recent times." Our state legislators in Columbus had a similar record. Cleveland.com reported that "2023 was least productive lawmaking year in Ohio since at least 1955." Nevertheless, MOAA persists in advocating for members of the uniformed services, their families, and veterans.

If you haven't already done so, please go to the website, https://moaa.quorum.us/ and review MOAA's current advocacy campaigns. Clicking on the "write" and "tell" buttons will allow you to easily share your views on MOAA's key issues with your elected federal officials. Take a few minutes to familiarize yourself with MOAA's advocacy by clicking on the photos at the top the https://moaa.quorum.us/ page (Key Advocacy Issues, etc.). The Action Center Tutorial button will answer most of your questions about using the site. Finally, please log into your account on the MOAA.org website and click on "Email Subscriptions." Enter your email address in the blank, click "search," and make sure that the MOAA Newsletter and Advocacy boxes are checked. This will ensure that you are kept informed of MOAA's latest advocacy news.

Although the FY24 National Defense Authorization Act was only recently passed, Congress will soon begin work on the FY 25 NDAA. MOAA has outlined its goals for that bill (https://www.moaa.org/content/publications-and-media/news-articles/2024-news-articles/advocacy/tricare,-star-act,-arlington-eligibility-among-moaas-fy-2025-ndaa-priorities). Among those goals is passing the Richard Star Act. This bill provides that combat-disabled uniformed services retirees with fewer than 20 years of creditable service may concurrently receive, without reduction, veterans' disability compensation and retired pay or combat-related special compensation. Other MOAA goals for the FY 25 NDAA include changes to the BAH to improve housing compensation, increasing job opportunities for military spouses, ending the claw back of the last month of retirement pay following the death of a retiree, expanding Arlington National Cemetery, and eliminating monthly premiums for Tricare Young Adult health insurance.
